Updated Waitlist Policy

Please keep in mind that trips are filled on a first come first serve basis. If a trip that you sign up for is full when your registration is processed we will call you that day to notify you. If a spot opens up before the trip takes place we will call you to notify you. You will not be charged for a trip that you are wait listed for unless a spot opens up and you agree to take it.

Registering for Programs: To register for trips & programs, you need to fill out September/October's registration form & mail or drop it off with payment.

Registrations are first come, first served. Registration forms will not be accepted without payment. Please keep this in mind as spots fill up FAST.

Payment: You must send in your full payment with your registration. Credit cards & checks will be processed as they come in to secure the first come first serve process. The payment processing company charges a \$3 minimum service fee charge up to \$114 & 2.65% thereafter to cardholders who use this service.

Communication: Please allow a minimum of 48 hrs for calls to be returned. If you are calling to cancel a trip please call (207)808-5400. We will call you with a pick-up time 1-3 days in advance & to confirm that you will still be attending.

Transportation: Transportation cost is built into each activity fee.

PLEASE NOTE THAT THE TRANSPORTATION COST IS NONREFUNDABLE. IF YOU CANCEL AT THE APPROPRIATE TIME, YOU WILL BE REFUNDED THE COST OF THE ACTIVITY ONLY (IF NOT ALREADY PRE – PURCHASED.)

The 62+ Staff does hold the right to refuse to take you on a trip that you have signed up for if he / she feels that you will not be successful based on past events or occurrences. Staff will notify you if your name is removed from a list. If it is after office hours, please leave a message on the answering machine.

Credits: Credits are issued as follows:

If we cancel an event, you are credited the full price.

In order to receive full credit for a trip that you cancel we need to be notified of the cancellation 24 hrs prior. If a seat or meal was reserved ahead of time, & we cannot find someone to take your spot, we will not be able to credit you for the activity for which you signed up.



62+ Program Code Of Conduct

GENERAL RULES

- Portland Parks, Recreation & Facilities is not responsible for lost, stolen or damaged personal items.
- Staff will not accept any personal items to hold (keys, wallets, cell phone, etc.)
- Staff, including bus drivers, are not allowed to accept tips.
- Participants are responsible for paying for their own entry fee, meals, etc. unless stated otherwise in the registration form.
- Smoking, vaping, or drug use is not allowed while out on 62+ Program trips.
- Alcohol is permitted when at a restaurant but in moderation. Keep in mind when out on trips with the 62+ Program you are representing the City. Excessive drinking or drinking that results in inappropriate behavior is not permitted.
- Possession of weapons is not prohibited.
- Participants are responsible for administering their own medications if needed.
- Individuals will be ready to go 15 minutes prior to their pick up time.
- Individuals are responsible for getting to and from the bus and their front door on their own.
- Individuals will notify the 62+ Program Leader if they cannot attend the trip before their designated pick up time.
- Appropriate behavior is expected from all participants.
- Unwanted and/or inappropriate touching of another person will not be tolerated.
- The use of vulgar language or any type of harassment will not be tolerated.
- Do not distract drivers when they are driving. Be respectful and mindful that they are responsible for safely bringing you to and from your destination.

Violations of this Code of Conduct may result in a warning or suspension or removal from the program After three (3) warnings, you will be asked to not return to our program; however, the City may suspend or remove a participant from the program before three (3) warnings depending on the severity of the conduct. We want to make this a fun time for all where participants feel safe and welcomed. All participants are expected to carefully review the rules and requirements set forth and are solely responsible for their actions. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Eligibility Requirements for Use of Portland Recreation's 62+ Senior Program Trips and Activities.

Participants must be:

- 62 years of age or older.
- Able to tell time and location / place.
- · Able to toilet independently.
- Able to ambulate consistent with the trip/activity and to get in and out of city vehicles with limited assistance.
- Behaviorally appropriate, i.e. not physically or verbally abusive to staff or other recreation participants.
- Able to participate in activity signed up for with limited assistance from staff. Able to get themselves out of their residence to meet the van / bus and back inside their residence with no assistance from staff, i.e. staff cannot enter participants' residences. Able to be ready on time when the van / bus arrives at their residence to pick them up to participate in recreation activities
- Able to be left unsupervised in public areas such as shopping centers, movies, theaters, fairs, etc. without wandering off or forgetting to meet at designated meeting times.
- Able to clearly understand why we are picking them up and where we are going. *Participants with a

disability who require an accommodation should contact the Recreation Leader at the time of registration.

I have read and understand the above eligibility requirements. By signing below I am stating that I meet all of the above requirements. I understand that the Recreation 62+ Program Staff reserve the right to discuss with myself or my emergency contact any questions or safety concerns they may have about my use of the program. I understand the City of Portland may revoke my right to use the program if I become unable to participate in the recreation programs or it otherwise becomes unsafe for me to participate.
